



CIVIL AVIATION AUTHORITY REPUBLIC OF MOLDOVA

SAFETY DIRECTIVE No. 01 – 29/01/2021

On removal of operational restrictions related to aircraft type Boeing model 737-8 & 737-9, all serial numbers (EASA Type Certificate no.EASA.IM.A.120) and repeal of DSA no.01 – 12/03/2019

This directive is issued in accordance with art.7 paragraph (3) 1) d) of the Aviation Code of the Republic of Moldova no.301/2017, and point 10 paragraph 1) d) of the Regulation on organization and functioning of the Civil Aviation Authority, approved through the Government Decision no.133/2019, taking into account the safety directive SD no.2021-01 of 27.01.2021 issued by European Aviation Safety Agency (EASA).

1. Shall be removed all the operational restrictions related to aircraft type Boeing model 737-8 & 737-9, all serial numbers, performing flights to/from or above the territory of the Republic of Moldova, provided that the air operators comply with the requirements specified under point 1 and 2 of this directive.
2. Air operators shall implement all the elements contained in the Federal Aviation Administration (FAA) AD 2020-24-02, or in EASA AD 2021-0039 or, where applicable, in any AD issued by the State of registry that contains the same elements as FAA AD 2020-24-02, or EASA AD 2021-0039.
3. Air operators shall ensure that all pilots operating flights on these aircraft have undergone the RTS training contained in FAA Flight Standardization Board Report for Boeing 737, Revision 17, Appendix 7 (Boeing 737 MAX Special training for flight crews).
4. Safety directive DSA no.01-12/03/2019 "On suspension of flights performed by aircraft type Boeing model 737-8 & 737-9, all serial numbers (EASA Type Certificate no.EASA.IM.A.120) shall be repealed from the date this directive is signed.
5. This directive is published on the website of the Civil Aviation Authority, www.caa.md, section "Legal framework/Directives" and is acknowledged to all air operators.
6. This directive enters into force from the date of signature.
